



**MINUTES OF THE THREE KINGS QUARRY LIAISON MEETING

1. Confirmation of Previous Minutes

Deborah Clapshaw declared the Meeting open at 7.05 pm, and sought confirmation of the Minutes of the previous Meeting held on 8th September 2008.

Moved by B. Chote, Seconded by R. Compton - Confirmed.

2. Matters / Actions Arising

Review of TSP Monitoring Plan

The revision of the Air Quality Management Plan to take into account continuous monitoring is to be posted on the Company's website when completed.

Action: Post on website when available

Batters Adjacent to Big King

- B. Chote spoke regarding the location of the quarry boundary adjacent to the Big King Reserve. He advised that he had reviewed the location of the fence and the boundary, and reported that the boundary is located on the slope below the fence.

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Big King Excavation Cross Section

A. Bell said he had received advice from his Solicitor to withhold the CAD diagram.

Air Quality

B. Chote advised that (in relation to a query re the Air Quality Report - emissions due to increased vehicle movements) this matter was considered by the expert assessor for the Application and he has reported the effects are expected to be no more than what is currently experienced on Mt Eden Road. Limits will also continue to stay in place.

3. Site Monitoring Report

Mike Harris presented the December 2008 Report as follows:

Groundwater Levels

- Groundwater levels in the quarry have been held above RL34m since October 2002.
- Groundwater levels in bores surrounding the quarry are generally following seasonal variations most recently reflecting the relatively dry spring following the very wet winter period.

Precise Level Surveys

- A survey of all precise level benchmarks was completed in April 2008.
- This survey is currently being undertaken annually, with the next precise level survey scheduled for March 2009.

Air Quality Monitoring

- The Continuous Real Time Dust Monitor has been operating since April 2008.
- The Hi-vol TSP samplers on the northern boundary and on the roof of the quarry office have been retained for a 12 month period to provide an overlap between the real time monitor and the Hi-vol samplers.
- Air quality monitoring results since mid August have all been pretty good.
- 50 samples were collected from the Hi-vol TSP samplers, all of which were less than 80mg/m³ per 24 hour period.
- Air quality monitoring results from the Continuous Monitor have also all been below 80mg/m³ per 24 hour period.

Rodent and Pest Control

- Further to the rodent tracking undertaken late last year, and following a comment made after the February 2008 meeting, possum traps have been set within the quarry area.
- These have been reasonably successful with 27 possums caught to date this year. These traps will continue to be set.

Will be carrying out a tracking exercise for rats.

Air Management Plan is still being finalised – this is a paperwork exercise following a review of the continuous monitoring. A plan is then forwarded to the ARC for approval, after which it will be added to the company's website.

A. Bell asked about the regularity of cleaning the video monitors at Foodtown – M. Harris replied that they are serviced on a monthly basis.

D. Taylor queried the frequency of precise survey monitoring – M. Harris advised the monitoring is carried out every April.

4. Quarry Complaints

T. Carpenter, Quarry Manager, reported that no complaints had been received over the past three months.

5. General Business

Cleanfill

R. Compton explained the difference between the terminology cleanfill and managed fill.

B. Chote advised that Sari Eru would demonstrate the XRF machine later at the conclusion of the meeting. R. Compton reiterated that Winstone Aggregates will not accept items for cleanfill which contain excessive levels of hydrocarbons etc., and will also not accept asbestos as that goes to landfill, not cleanfills.

Timeline for the Application

Draft copies of Consent Applications have gone to the Councils for comment prior to formal submission. The supporting documents are available on the company's website. Contact R. A zone change is also required before any future development or use. This is being done as a parallel process. ACC are due to notify their District Plan in approximately 2010.
